# **Director of Library Publishing**

This is a new position at the UNT Libraries. I began in May 2014. My main duties are to:

- 1. provide new forms of scholarly publishing
- 2. create publications that promote the Libraries' unique collections
- (1) is offered as a service to the UNT community, so that's what I'm going to talk about today.

This service is not intended for tenure-track faculty! And this is not the only model for library-based publishing out there.



I have no illusions that tenure-track faculty at UNT will be interested in publishing with me because I offer no peer-review mechanism and no prestige, both of which factor into promotion and tenure decisions.

- UNT Press (if they select your title and you're willing to pay for at least 50 copies to be printed)
- Amazon CreateSpace, Blurb, Lulu, etc.

e-books:

• Amazon Kindle Direct Publishing, Blurb, Smashwords, Lulu, iBooks Author, etc.
